Based at Mendelsham in Suffolk, the crew of "Ol' Buddy" was the first aircrew assigned to 7th Squadron, 34th Bomb Group, Eighth Air Force, to complete 20 combat missions. According to the official history of the US Army Air Forces, "Ol' Buddy" was lost on a day of unusually heavy air activity that witnessed effective bombing of enemy targets at Hemmingstedt, Magdeburg, and the Ruhr.
