Eugene Eubank started his flying career in the U. S. Army Signal Reserve Corps in 1918 and was commissioned in the Air Service in 1920. His distinguished career included assignments as chief of flight test, instructor at the Air Corps Tactical School, and commander of numerous bomb squadrons and groups. He served as bomber commander in the Philippines, Java and Australia in World War II. After the war he progressively commanded air divisions and air forces retiring in 1954. He was awarded the Distinguished Service Medal, Silver Star, Distinguished Flying Cross and many other decorations. He died at the age of 104.
